Kansas State Performance Plan: Indicator 1: Graduation

What does Indicator 1 measure?

Indicator 1 measures the percent of youth with an individualized education program (IEP) graduating from high school with a regular diploma.

What is the data source?

All districts in the state report data to the Kansas State Department of Education (KSDE). Graduation data comes from local school district exit records entered into the KSDE Kansas Individual Data on Students (KIDS) system according to the ESEA Title I ([https://www.ksde.gov/Portals/0/CSAS/CSASHome/Graduation and Schools of Choice/ESSA Graduation Rate Guidance.pdf](https://www.ksde.gov/Portals/0/CSAS/CSASHome/Graduation%20and%20Schools%20of%20Choice/ESSA%20Graduation%20Rate%20Guidance.pdf)) reporting requirements of the U.S. Department of Education.

Reported graduation data are lagged one year. For example, for FFY19 reporting, SY18-19 graduation data will be reported to the U.S. Department of Education.

What are targets?

The following table reflects the targets and data for the current five-year APR reporting cycle.
