Kansas State Performance Plan: Indicator 2: Dropout

What does Indicator 2 measure?

Indicator 2 measures percent of youth with an individualized education program (IEP) dropping out of high school.

What is the data source?

All districts in the state report data to the Kansas State Department of Education (KSDE). The source of Special Education Enrollment Count is the Kansas Individual Data on Students (KIDS) system End of Year Assessment (EOYA) and EXIT data. Dropout data come from local school district exit records entered into the KSDE Kansas Individual Data on Students (KIDS) system according to the ESEA Title I reporting requirements of the U.S. Department of Education.

Reported dropout data are lagged one year. For example, for FFY19 reporting, SY18-19 graduation data will be reported to the U.S. Department of Education.

What are targets?

The following table reflects the targets and data for the current five-year APR reporting cycle.
