

SUICIDE & CRISIS LIFELINE



- 545,472 calls answered monthly
- 98% of calls answered
- 90 second average to answer a call
- 17 minute average to resolve "crisis" and find support

Barriers


Underrepresentation in data for students facing justice involvement, McKinney Vinto status, foster placements, and migrant status due to opt in addressed as a health care parity concern

No clear pathway identified for HS students in behavioral health professions- work to identify the need through Department of Commerce- develop clear IPS pathway

Transition plans are not including training for students to learn how to maintain access to BH/MH services post-graduation
