

# Kansas 2023 Average Annual Earning and Poverty Rate by Education Level



### High School Graduation Rates






### Five Year Average Postsecondary Effective Rate

### Advanced Placement Total number of exams and passing scores


#### Kansas 2025 AP Participation and Performance

### Kansas Board of Regents High School Students Taking Post Secondary Classes




### High School Graduation Matters



The number of high school students enrolled in college-credit courses has risen 30.7% since 2016.

This indicates more students are academically prepared and confident enough to take on college-level rigor while still in high school.

### Kansas Board of Regents High School Total Credit Hours in Post Secondary




### High School Graduation Matters

- This consistent upward trend suggests more students are pursuing high-demand, skills-based training that leads to immediate employment and economic mobility.



- CTE course enrollment has increased from 226,968 in 2021 to 266,012 in 2025, a clear positive trend.








### Results – 1<sup>st</sup> grade Fall to Spring
