First Kansas International Winner

After being placed on hold type with one reprein 2020 due to Covid, the National School Transportation Association has brought back the International Safe Driving Competition. On June 29-30, the best school bus drivers from across the United States and Canada gathered in Austin, Texas for the competition where they are tested on their knowledge and driving skills. The number of competitors was down significantly from previous years as many states have either abandoned their state competitions or have completely closed their state associations who hosted these types of events.

Eligibility in the International competition is based on the competitors score, not where they placed in the state's competition. A maximum of two contestants per bus

senting the public sector and the other representing the private sector per state are invited to participate.

Since there were no contractor contestants in this year's state competition in the transit style bus, 5 school bus drivers representing Kansas made the trek to Austin, Texas. Representing minibuses were Dorothy Dorman (First Student Wichita) and Brian Inloes (Auburn-Washburn USD 437).

Martin Myrtle (First Student Wichita) and Anna Cooper (Auburn-Washburn USD 437) represented the conventional buses and Jerry Guerrero (Garden City USD 457) represented Transit buses.

Competitors checked-in for the competition on Saturday, June 29, attended orienta-

> tion and took their written test. The competition was held June 30 at Havs ISD in Uhland, TX. The NSTA Annual Awards Banquet was held that evening

results. In the conventional bus category Martin Myrtle placed 19th and Anna Cooper placed 29th. Jerry Guerrero placed an impressive 4th in transit bus. However, it was Dorothy Dorman who took the night's top honors in the minibus category and is now designated as the top school bus driver in the US and Canada. Dorothy has been driving a bus for First Student Wichita since 2008 and has participating in safe driving competitions since 2009. This is the first time a Kansas school bus driver has won top honors at the International Competition. Brian Inloes also finished an impressive 4th place in the minibus category.

We are very proud of all of our competitors who represented Kansas.

Back-To-School Ideas for School Transportation

- 1. Have t-shirts made for your transportation staff that say "ask me about my job"
- 2. Create business cards for your drivers to distribute when talking to others about driving a bus that tell them how to become a school transportation employee in your district.
- 3. Put a bus outside of each school location that is hosting a "back-to-school" night. Take this time to remind kids of the bus rules, let new riders become familiar with the bus, and take the opportunity to recruit new bus drivers.
- 4. Schedule "potential new driver" ride along events.
- 5. Post on your district's website videos of your transportation staff giving testimonials about why they love their job
- 6. Set up a booth at the local farmers market giving out "stop for the bus" flyers, driver recruitment info, etc.
- 7. Host a "stuff the bus" event collecting school supplies for your district, and again have driver recruitment info available.
- 8. Park a bus in a highly visible location with a banner that says "NOW HIRING".
- 9. Ensure your transportation staff are included in ALL back to school activities/events. Make them "part of the school district team"
