The National School Bus Loading and Unloading Survey is a collection of fatality accident reports provided by state agencies responsible for school transportation and/or accident records.* The Kansas State Department of Education (KSDE), along with the help of the National Association of State Directors of Pupil Transportation Services, asks that all states and Washington, D.C., provide data to the agency; KSDE compiles it for this survey. Only fatalities involving school children in or around the loading or unloading areas of a school bus are included.

This survey is provided annually to the school transportation industry in an effort to raise awareness of the dangers involved in loading and unloading school children. Fatalities — which are caused by a variety of circumstances and errors by passing motorists and school bus drivers — continue to take place. This shows the continuing need for forceful, advanced instruction to educate bus drivers and students, as well as the need to increase our efforts to thoroughly inform drivers across the country about the requirements of the school bus stop arm law.

2023-2024 NATIONAL SCHOOL BUS LOADING AND UNLOADING SURVEY Reports of Fatalities By State

New York

A bus was pulling into its loading zone at school. An 8-year-old boy ran in front of the bus and was struck and killed by the right front wheel of the bus.

A 5-year-old girl had unloaded from the bus. The bus driver did not see her as she crossed in front of the bus. The bus moved forward knocking the student down with the left front of the bus. As the bus continued moving forward, the student was struck and killed by the left rear dual wheels.

Rhode Island

Refused to participate.

New Jersey Refused to participate.

Georgia

An 8-year-old girl was crossing the street to board the bus. The bus was stopped with the stop arm and eight-way lights activated. An oncoming vehicle did not stop, and the student was struck and killed.

Florida

A 9-year-old boy had unloaded from the school bus. The student dropped a football and crawled under the bus to retrieve it. The student was struck and killed by the right rear dual wheels of the bus.

Alabama

A 15-year-old girl was in the front yard of her residence walking to board the bus. The stop arm and eight-way lights were activated. An approaching vehicle from the front swerved to the right and passed properly stopped vehicles, crossed back onto the roadway between the front of the bus and the stopped vehicles. The vehicle struck and killed the student in her yard prior to striking the student's residence.

Texas

A 15-year-old boy had unloaded from the school bus. The stop arm and eight-way lights were activated. A semi driver struck a properly stopped vehicle behind the bus and swerved to the right. The student was struck and killed by the semi.
