Revised Guidance: Foreign Exchange Students

 It is advised to screen any students who have another language indicated on their Home Language Survey to ensure all students have an opportunity to receive support because of civil rights obligations.

Serving Foreign Students (2010)


Foreign Exchange Students, continued...

- If a student participating in an exchange program scores not proficient on an approved screener, you would follow the same procedure as you would any other identified student.
- This guidance will be included in next year's Framework.



English Learner Framework

- Available on the <u>KSDE website</u>
- <u>Feedback Form</u>: Comments will be collected until November 15th so that updates for next year can start being made.
- Form will stay active but asking for the majority of comments by November so there is time to make necessary changes.



WIDA Alternate ACCESS

- WIDA Alternate ACCESS is given to identified English learners (ELs) with the most significant cognitive disabilities during the annual testing window.
- District Test Coordinators (DTC), Building Test Coordinators (BTC), and Test Administrators (TA) can utilize the <u>WIDA Alternate ACCESS Checklist</u> to stay informed on tasks that need to be completed before, during, and after the test window.

Collaborative Conversations

- To learn language, students must USE language.
- Benefits of peer conversations:
 - Increase percentage of students who are actively engaged
 - Increase opportunities for students to talk
 - Increase opportunities for students to deepen thinking
 - Foster academic language development
 - Create low-risk opportunities to participate
 - Increase opportunities to listen to students and gather formative data



Best Tasks for Collaborative Conversation

- Building up ideas together through multiple exchanges
- Deepening learning specific to the goals of the lesson
- Communicating higher-order thinking
- Sharing diverse perspectives
- Using academic language relevant to the task
